What to do

1. Draw a horizontal line slightly above the middle of your page. This is your horizon line.
2. Draw a small 'x' in the centre of your line. This is known as the vanishing point.
3. Draw a rectangle in the centre of your page with the horizon line going through it and the vanishing point in its centre.
4. Next for your walls you'll need to draw four lines going from the vanishing point, each line needs to go through a corner of the rectangle which is the back wall of your room.
5. Now, the fun part - time to decorate your room with all things that represent you!
6. We played with the colour palette before committing, and found a contrasting yet complementary colour scheme.
7. We created various symbolic images by cutting out paint tester cards, then adding detail using fine liner.
8. Here it is, your very own fantasy room that encompasses your very essence! Stand back and admire your room, and be proud of your personhood.
