Ealing, London: Following a successful crowdfunding campaign, Pitzhanger Manor & Gallery is delighted to be able to put on *Pride of England*, a community-focused exhibition celebrating the diversity, unity, and community legacy of the England football teams. Central to the exhibition are England's *Three Lions*: sculptures co-created by artist Matt

Small with young people in Ealing, which then accompanied the England Men's Football Team to Germany for EURO 2024.

The *Three Lions* sculptures, created from recycled footballs with the help of local children at Pitzhanger and across Ealing, are a testament to the borough's creativity and community spirit. Commissioned for the Football Association (FA), these sculptures travelled with the England team to Germany, each sculpture emblazoned with written and drawn messages of support, creating a "collective love letter" of national unity and pride to accompany the team during the tournament.

See Your Favourite Footballers

In addition to the sculptures, the exhibition will showcase portraits of football icons, including Ealing-born stars Bukayo Saka and Chloe Kelly, who have inspired millions.

Some of these works were created around the time of EURO 2020, a pivotal moment when the England Men's Football Team, led by Gareth Southgate, captured the nation's admiration by embodying unity and resilience. Southgate's leadership, recently recognised with a knighthood in the New Year Honours, and the team's refusal to be divided in the face of racism, encapsulated the spirit of a modern, inclusive England. These portraits, generously loaned from the Moniker Art Foundation collection, celebrate players like Marcus Rashford and Jadon Sancho, who stood against discrimination and became role models for a nation, bringing the country together in an unprecedented way.

Matt Small says: *"The Three Lions are not just sculptures, they are symbols of teamwork and belonging. They represent strength in diversity and the pride we feel when we come together as a community. Bringing them back to Ealing, where they were created, feels like the perfect conclusion to this journey."*

Visitors are invited to engage with the exhibition by expressing what it means to belong to and have pride in your community. The exhibition will also feature photos and videos capturing the *Three Lions* in Germany with the football team, offering a special behind-the-scenes perspective on this international project.

penalty taking, which was such a key theme in the England team's EUROs quest; Art critic Orit Gat will discuss football as a prism through which to explore questions about immigration, nationalism, race, gender, money, love, and the possibility of belonging. And artist Matt Small will discuss how he sought to convey the inspiration of the players and their team spirit through art.

Family Workshops and Spring Half-term Activities

Additional events include family-friendly workshops during the Spring half-term holiday (15–23 February) combining workshops to inspire young people in both sport and art. Also, a special Teachers' CPD session on 23 January, in partnership with the University of West London, will equip educators with creative tools to inspire their students through themes of teamwork and resilience.

This exhibition is a celebration of collective effort, made possible by our community who supported the project through our crowdfunding campaign. Pitzhanger thanks all those who generously donated to the campaign, and Moniker Art Foundation for helping us meet our target.

Clare Gough, Director of Pitzhanger Manor & Gallery, says: *"Thanks to the support of our community, we are thrilled to be bringing the 'Three Lions' home to Ealing, together with this fascinating exhibition, celebrating what it means to represent England and the impact of the national teams in local communities."*

Matt Small is a London-based artist renowned for his dynamic, socially conscious works. Known for using recycled materials like discarded car bonnets and old signs as his canvas, Small's art celebrates underrepresented individuals and communities. His work explores themes of identity, diversity, and belonging. A graduate of the Royal College of Art, his innovative pieces have been exhibited widely in the UK and the US. Small's art reflects his belief in the transformative power of creativity to inspire pride, connection, and community engagement.

About Pitzhanger Manor & Gallery

Pitzhanger Manor & Gallery, built 1800–1804, is the historic country home of one of the most remarkable English architects, Sir John Soane. Pitzhanger's mission is to promote Soane's legacy, inspiring visitors with art, architecture, and design and nurturing creativity for all. The museum celebrates not only Soane's lasting influence as a designer, but also combines his architecture with a programme of ambitious contemporary art exhibitions across the house and contemporary gallery. Pitzhanger runs an extensive learning outreach and events programme. Pitzhanger reopened in spring 2019 following a major £12-million conservation and restoration project to return the Manor to Soane's original design, with support from NLHF, ACE, Ealing Council, and other generous donors.
